Each tonne of used glass (cullet) in a glass furnace saves 1.2 tonnes of raw materials and 150 litres of oil

Glass coffee jars; salad dressing, cook-in sauces as well as wine/ beer bottles can all go into bottle banks
Pyrex, Visionware and drinking glasses are not recyclable; they melt at a different temperature.

Recycling one glass bottle saves enough energy to power a T.V for an hour and a half!

Manufacturing glass from cullet reduces energy consumption by 20% and water consumption by up to 50%
